I. BACKGROUND OF THE INITIATIVE

- The Annex 7 of the revised Bangui Agreement (2001)
 - TCEs as part of traditional cultural heritage (art. 67 and 68)
 - Consequence:TCEs are part of public domain
- Lack of regional protection of TK and TCEs
 - Failure of the 2008 Niamey (Niger) Annex on protection of TCEs
 - Lack of ratification by member states
 - Missing opportunity of the 2015 Bamako Agreement
- The Initiative (WIPI Mandate): Drafting annex on protection of TCEs

STEPS TOWARDS POLICY FORMULATION

- Brainstorming
 - Discussing about the initiative (five sessions of discussion with Pr A. Tankoano)
 - Determining problematic and critical issues (beneficiaries, scope of protection, transboundary TCEs,...) and division of tasks between experts
 - Considering political and economical context (AfCFTA, PAIPO, African Group at IGC)
- Drafting the text
 - (one and half month)
- Reviewing the text
 - (one month of exchanges with Pr A. Tankoano)

KEY ELEMENTS OF THE BILL

- Tiered or differentiated approach
- Disclosure of origin
- Beneficiaries
- Exceptions
- Customary law as ground for Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR)

CHALLENGES FACED

- Accessing information from OAPI member states
- Finding a balance between needs of OAPI, position of the African Group and objectives of the PAIPO and the AfCFTA
- Definition of beneficiaries
- Choosing a regional approach over the national approach
- Including customary law as part of the new IP legal framework

PERSONAL EXPERIENCE AND LESSON LEARNED

 Considering different aspects (political, social, cultural and economical) and interests of stakeholders without forgetting the main goal: legal protection of IP rights of indigenous people and local communities
